VISIT our voyageur encampment and climb under an overturned 36-foot birch bark canot du maître. Then, try a true-to-life 90-pound canoe pack. Or, pick up a paddle and try for 50 to 60 strokes per minute, the way the voyageurs did...

GATHER AROUND the faux fire in our birch bark winter wigwam and listen to a recorded story being told by a Mi'kmag elder.

BANG ON OUR CANOE DRUM - a full-size canoe that's been turned into a drum!

PADDLE WITH US as part of a Voyageur Canoe Tour up and over the Peterborough Lift Lock on the Trent-Severn Waterway. This 90-minute guided paddle in a 36-foot replica of a voyageur canoe is family-friendly and suitable for almost all ages and abilities. Sign up for one of our tours or schedule your own!

"Being in the canoe museum reminds me of early days at the family cottage on Stoney Lake. There were six of us on a small island with only a canoe and one small boat with a 7.5-horsepower Evinrude. It seemed somebody always had the small boat on the other side, so most often the only way to get off the island was to paddle the canoe. Remembering that, and the role of the canoe in shaping Canada, we have been delighted to support the work of the museum over the years.

This year, we'll begin building a new museum at the water's edge in Peterborough, Ontario – a stunning 85,000 square-foot facility where the world's largest collection of paddled watercraft will be cared for and showcased. This oneof-a-kind cultural centre will feature 50.000 square feet of engaging exhibit areas, a 1.5-acre accessible green roof, and a 100-foot indoor water feature. AND, visitors will walk in the front door, and paddle out the back.

A \$65 million capital campaign is supporting this once-in-a-lifetime endeavour.
