Hospice Quinte Care Centre - Make It Happen!

On September 30th, Hospice Quinte was thrilled to host local dignitaries, friends and other significant supporters to celebrate our official kick-off of the community phase of the *Heart & Home Building Campaign!* Our event was hosted at Occasions by the Bay, who arranged a lovely socially distanced outdoor gathering, with musical entertainment provided by Juno Award winner Al Lerman! Thank you to both for your contributions to our milestone event! Also, special thanks to our additional sponsor +VG – The Ventin Group.

Our launch began by announcing that Hospice Quinte has now reached 65% of our \$9.5M fundraising goal with \$3,325,000 left to raise. We were also excited to introduce our new slogan for the campaign - 'Make It Happen'. This slogan represents a community call for support to those living in the region to contribute what they can to help raise the remaining funds needed to successfully complete the *Heart & Home Building Campaign.*

At the launch, Jennifer May-Anderson, Executive Director, shared, "Standing here today, surrounded by a number of key contributors, I am filled with joy and gratitude knowing that we are well on our way to meeting the critical need for around-the-clock hospice palliative care locally. We wouldn't be here today if it wasn't for so many thoughtful, caring individuals, governments and businesses."

Local dignitaries, including the offices of MPP Todd Smith and MPP Daryl Kramp, Belleville Mayor Mitch Panciuk, Quinte West Mayor Jim Harrison, and Tyendinaga Township Reeve Rick Philips, shared comments of support regarding the many benefits that the future Hospice Quinte Care Centre will provide to those in need throughout the greater Quinte region.

Hospice Quinte was also delighted to receive support from a number of caring donors during the launch, including a generous gift of \$20,000 from Paul Moran Insurance Group

in conjunction with The Co-operators Advisor Community Fund, and an exceptional \$100,000 donation from Paul and Beth Moorman of Culligan Belleville, in memory of their father Ronald Moorman. Audrey Williams also made a gift of \$30,000 on behalf of her family, and in loving memory of her son and former Campaign Co-Chair John Williams. This brings collective contributions made by the Williams Family and friends, to a total of \$184,000! John's legacy continues for which we are truly appreciative.

The event closed after Quinte West Mayor Jim Harrison presented Hospice Quinte with a cheque for \$1,065,395 on behalf of the City of Quinte West. The City had generously pledged \$1M at the beginning of the project, which was invested until the official ground-breaking of the Centre earlier
